

GENERAL INFO

Ages

Any and all boys ages 9-17 – Archie Miller Basketball Camps are open to any and all entrants (limited only by number, age and grade level).

Cost

Day Commuter Camper: \$525 per Session

Boarding Overnight Camper: \$399 per Session

Camp tuition is due in full at the time of registration. A processing fee of \$5.78 will be added at checkout.

Cancellation Policy

There is a \$50 cancellation fee prior to the start of camp and there are no refunds available for a cancellation during the camp week.

Commuter Campers

Commuter campers participate in the same activities as boarding campers except for breakfast in the campus cafeteria and staying overnight in the dorms. Commuter campers are expected to have breakfast prior to their arrival at Simon Skjodt Assembly Hall.

CHECK-IN

Check-in takes place from **12pm** until **2:30pm** on the first day of camp.

CHECK-OUT

All campers must be checked out and picked up by 4pm on the last day of camp. On the last day of each session of camp, check-out will take place in the South Lobby of Simon Skjodt Assembly Hall. Boarding campers will be required to have their rooms inspected and to turn in their room keys prior to departure.

ROOMS/ROOMMATES

Rooms

Archie Miller Basketball campers stay in Briscoe student dorms. The dorms we use so have wi-fi available and are air-conditioned. The rooms do not have refrigerators or microwaves.

The dorm is located directly across Simon Skjodt Assembly Hall. Each dorm room has either a fully private or semi-private bathroom with a shower. The semi-private bathroom is shared with 1 other dorm room.

Boarding campers are only permitted to return to their dorm rooms during lunch time and at the end of the camp day. Day campers are not permitted in the dormitories.

Roommates

The rooms available for our camp are double-occupancy. We do not have triple-occupancy rooms available so, unfortunately, will not be able to meet requests for triple rooms.

Roommate requests can be made. Please email coacharchiemiller@gmail.com with your roommate preference. Please try to ensure spelling accuracy so we can easily locate the roommate on our roster.

If no roommate request is made, your camper will be assigned a double room with another camper in his age group.

WHAT TO BRING TO CAMP

Please label all belongings.

- Basketball shoes
- Basketball shorts
- Athletic socks
- T-shirts
- Toiletries
- Small bag to transport personal items from dorm/dining/Simon Skjodt Assembly Hall

Each camper is responsible for bringing his own linens and towels, we recommend:

- Sheets (twin, extra-long)
- Pillow and pillow case
- Blanket
- Bath and face towels

Campers are permitted to bring cell phones, iPads, etc. to camp but we strongly recommend that these items be left locked in the camper's dorm room. The camp is not responsible for lost items. If your camper chooses to carry a bag around to gyms, please make sure the bag is clearly identifiable and labeled with his name.

For campers who need to carry medication with them throughout the camp day, we recommend a string backpack labeled clearly with the camper's name. Medication can also be left with our Certified Health Care Supervisor.

TEAMS

Our primary goal in forming camp teams is to ensure balanced competition. Teams are assigned based on age and height, and are adjusted by our coaching staff during evaluation games on the first day. We do not honor team assignment requests.

SECURITY

Only campers and Archie Miller Basketball Camp staff are permitted in the cafeteria and dormitories. The camper's dorm key will only allow them access to their assigned floor and room.

ATHLETIC TRAINERS

We have certified health care supervisors that available around the clock during camp sessions including in each of the gyms in which camp activities are taking place and overnight in the dorms.

VISITORS

For security reasons, visitors are not allowed in the dormitories except for during check-in and check-out. Visitors are also not allowed in the dining hall. If you have a special request to visit your camper in the dorm or dining hall please contact the camp staff. Family and visitors are welcome to observe daily camp activities and are invited to sit in the stands during any of the camp lectures, stations, or games.

DISCIPLINE

Archie Miller Basketball Camp has a zero tolerance policy on bullying. All campers are expected to conform to this and all standards of behavior established by the camp director. Disruptive behavior could result in dismissal.

MORE INFORMATION/ FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

I submitted a waiver when I registered online, do I need to bring anything else to registration?

Yes! We need to collect a hard copy of the signed waiver and release form from every participant. The waiver form will be emailed out closer to camp.

What do I do if my child has an allergy, medication to take, or other medical condition that I would like to discuss with your camp's medical personnel?

Our certified health care supervisors are able to work with you. Please let us know during registration and we will assist you.

What size sheets do I need to bring?

Extra-long twin sheets (the standard in college dormitories) will work best. Some campers prefer to bring sleeping bags and sleep inside them on top of the bed. Don't forget your camper's pillow and towels.

Can I help my camper move into his or her dorm?

Yes, parents and family are welcome to help their campers get set up in the dorms on check-in day and to help them get moved out on the last day of camp.

How does the camp punch cards work?

We will collect money for your camper's punch card at our registration tables at the beginning of camp. Your camper will be given a punch card with his name. The punch cards can be bought in \$10 increments. We recommend that the punch card is safely kept in the camper's bag. He will be able to use his punch card during games and free time when the concession stand is open.

Where will the campers be staying at?

The campers will be housed in Briscoe. The dorm is located directly across Simon Skjodt Assembly Hall. Each dorm room has either a fully private or semi-private bathroom with a shower. The semi-private bathroom is shared with 1 other dorm room.

Where will the campers be eating?

All campers will eat Breakfast, Lunch, and Dinner in Gresham food court. Gresham Food Court is just down the street from Briscoe Dormitory.

How do meals work?

All campers get a single meal card/keycard. That card is preloaded with the exact amount of money to last them until their last meal. Meals are all you can eat. Also, their keycard/meal card allows them access to the Briscoe tower assigned. The campers only get entry access to their assigned floor and room.

How will the campers be transported to each location (Briscoe Dorm, Gresham Food Court, and Simon Skjodt Assembly Hall)?

All campers will be escorted by camp staffers while going to each location and campers will be counted to ensure safe transportation. The walk from Briscoe to Gresham Food Court is about 4 minutes. The walk from Briscoe to Simon Skjodt Assembly Hall is about 2 minutes.

How does supervision work in the dormitories?

There is at least one camp staff member staying on each floor of the camp dormitories. These coaches will ensure that all occupants of each room are present in their dorm rooms just prior to lights-out. The staff will be staying in a room on the hall overnight. Each room may be locked from the inside and only the campers have keys to their room. The campers lock their rooms at night. Our campus is also always monitored by campus police just as it is for our students during the school year.

Will someone wake my camper up in the mornings?

Yes, the dorm coaches will knock on each door in the mornings to be sure that the campers are awake for breakfast.

Can I take my camper off-campus for a meal?

Yes. You are welcome to take your camper off-campus, but you must sign him out with a camp staff member in Simon Skjodt Assembly Hall so that we can verify that he is leaving with a parent or other authorized adult and so that we can make note for any camp attendance check that he may miss.

Can I join my camper in the cafeteria or the dorms?

Special requests can be made for you to eat with your camper in the dining hall. Please contact a camp staffer if you request to eat with your camper. For all other circumstances for the campers' safety we cannot allow parents or family members in the cafeteria or in the dorms after move-in. Only our campers and our coaches and camp personnel are allowed in the cafeteria and dorms with our campers. Parents and family members will be allowed back in the dorms to assist their campers during check-out.

Will my camper be able to go back to his dorm room during the day?

Yes, campers are able to go back to their dormitories during breaks for lunch and dinner.

Can my camper bring his cell phone or iPod around camp during the day?

We do not have restrictions against cell phones and iPods at camp. However, we strongly recommend that these devices be left locked in the dorm rooms during the day. Cell phones and iPods are not permitted to be used during camp lectures, stations or games so the time that the device could be used is limited. Additionally, we have had many instances of such devices' being misplaced during camp days.

Which Indiana student-athletes will be around camp during my session?

Current Indiana Basketball student-athletes will be around our camp. However, due to the busy nature of most of their schedules, we are not able to announce which players will be around during the week. It is commonplace for our current student-athletes who are on campus in summer school to serve as coaches and referees for camp games. So you can certainly expect to see some familiar Indiana Basketball faces.

What happens if my camper loses his key?

If a camper loses his meal/keycard, he should report it to a camp staff member right away. We can get a spare key to him within a couple of hours. The charge for a lost key is \$15. We will contact parents or families to collect this \$15 after the camp session is over. The fee goes directly to the replacement of the door lock and keys. Archie Miller Basketball Camp does not profit from funds collected for lost keys.
